The project was funded by the Department of Science and Technology's Women and Nutrition scheme and aimed to improve the nutritional and financial status of semi-rural poor women in selected villages in Kengeri Hobli, Bangalore. Awareness programs were organized and over 300 beneficiaries attended. The programs included a questionnaire that was developed with the help of nutritionists and dieticians, which collected data on the health status of the beneficiaries. To further understand their health status, Padmashree Diagnostics in Bengaluru conducted tests on the HB and blood sugar levels of the participants. The project aimed to provide these women with the tools and resources they need to enhance their nutritional and financial well-being.

PROGRAMS CONDUCTED AT CHIKKAMUNAVADI, RAMANAGARA DISTRICT

Dr. Umalatha conducted an extension training program on December 7, 2020 as a part of DST Project to utilize Silkworm pupae waste for the development of a value-added product for resellers in Ramanagara district. The waste was used to make feed for poultry and fish. The resellers discussed and cleared all doubts about fish feed preparation. The presentation was given in the local language, Kannada and explained the process of making the feed step-by-step, emphasizing the right proportions of ingredients. The fish and poultry feed was made using nutritious silkworm pupae waste.





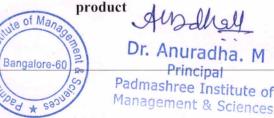

PROGRAMS CONDUCTED AT KALYA, RAMANAGARA DISTRICT



Training and awareness programs on the preparation of feed from silkworm pupae were conducted for farmers in the villages of Ramanagara district on January 23 and February 8, 2021, in Kalya village. These programs aimed to educate the farmers on how to make nutritious feed for their poultry and fish using silkworm pupae waste.

Program Summary

Dr. Umalatha conducted an extension training program on the utilization of silkworm pupae for the development of a value-added product for resellers in Ramanagara district as part of a DST project. Ramanagara district is a hub for silk reeling, resulting in a large amount of waste generated from silkworm pupae. The aim of the project was to convert this waste into a valuable product like feed for poultry and fish. The training program was held on January 23 and February 8, 2021, in Thagikuppae Villages of Ramanagara district and demonstrated how to prepare the feed, emphasizing the importance of using the right proportions of ingredients. The importance of this training for the resellers of Ramanagara was also discussed, as unscientific disposal of the silkworm pupae waste can cause environmental hazards and a foul odor, leading to a lower market price for the unprocessed pupae. By using the waste to make nutritional feed for fish and poultry, the resellers could improve their income.

Awareness about health and hygiene is disseminated by rallies, walkathons, street plays and conducted programs on usage of masks, sanitation, telemedicine, tele nutrition counselling during pandemic and importance of yoga.

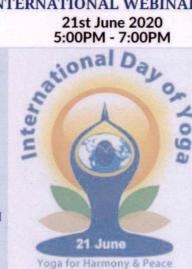

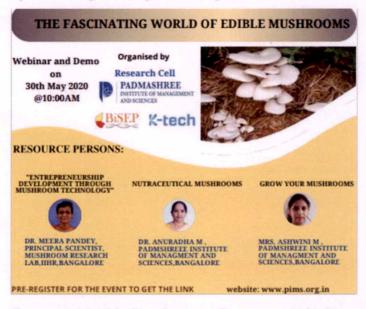

EXHIBITIONS AND ENVIRONMENTAL AWARENESS CAMP

Single use plastic awareness and household waste management program at Kommaghatta School:

On July 27th, 2022, students from B.Sc. participated in an awareness program at Kommaghatta School. The program focused on the issue of single-use plastic and household waste management. The students discussed the harmful effects of plastic and provided tips on reducing plastic usage. They also highlighted the importance of waste segregation, recycling, and converting wet waste into compost. The goal of the program was to educate and raise awareness among school students on the importance of waste management and reducing plastic usage to help protect the environment.

Awareness Programme on Air and Water Pollution

As part of NSS activity, the institute organized an awareness program on air and water pollution. The program was led by Dr. Thammaiah, NSS program coordinator, and Dr. Nethra, an assistant professor, and included undergraduate students. The team visited a local village and government school to raise awareness among the community and school children on the importance of keeping their surroundings healthy. The volunteers arrived at the location around 10:30 AM and visited the Kommaghatta lake to educate people about water pollution and the measures that can be taken to prevent it. The students distributed information leaflets with details on how to control water pollution. The program aimed to increase awareness about environmental issues and promote sustainable practices for a healthy environment. In the second half, the volunteers visited a government school and educated the students about the causes and the effects of air pollution and water pollution. The children took part actively in the interactive session and were curious to know about the safety measures could be followed to prevent water and air pollution. The event was fruitful as our volunteers successfully completed the NSS camp and educated the villagers and school children.

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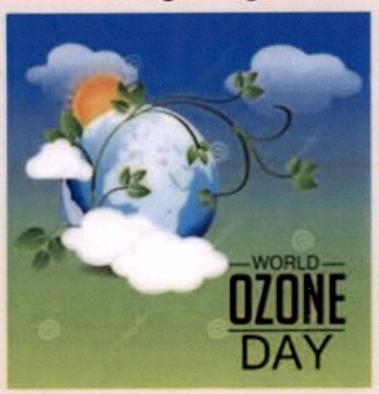

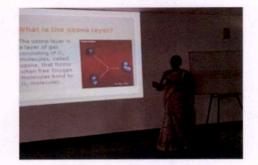

Program Summary

The webinar "Sustainable Urban Waste Management" was organized by Padmashree Institute of Management and Sciences on June 20th, 2020. It was open to the public and received more than 800 registrations. The aim was to create awareness on the importance of managing urban waste in a sustainable manner to reduce the negative environmental impacts. The speakers discussed the best practices for waste management, including sorting urban waste into organic and inorganic streams which can be turned into energy and fertilizer, a more efficient and environmentally friendly solution.

Poornayurdhama: Two Day Nature Camp

The two-day Nature Camp organized by Poornayurdhama in association with Adamya Chethana and Vibhu Foundation aimed to educate participants on lifestyle and environment. On the first day, there was a lifestyle education program including yoga and lectures on Ayurveda by Dr. Murli. On the second day, "Green Sunday" was celebrated with an environment awareness program and planting of medicinal and aromatic plants. 25 students from Padmashree Institute of Management and Sciences participated actively in the program and volunteered in planting trees and creating awareness among the community.

Awareness on Protection of Ozone Layer

The celebration of World Ozone Day at Padmashree Institute of Management and Sciences emphasized the importance of protecting the ozone layer. 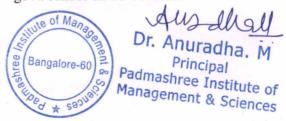
