The program was held on 27th July, 2022 and focused on "Healthy Cooking Practices" for village women. The students of M.Sc. 2nd year Clinical Nutrition and Dietetics and Food and Nutrition gave subjective and theoretical knowledge to the women about the topic. They explained various cooking techniques such as pressure cooking, roasting, blanching, poaching, soaking and sprouting, grilling, baking, steaming, boiling, and fermentation. The program started with an introduction to the topic and included practical demonstrations by the students. The women were questioned about their current cooking practices and the students explained the advantages and disadvantages of different cooking techniques. The program was successful in raising awareness and educating the community about the importance of healthy cooking practices. The program received positive feedback from the women, and it was especially helpful that the session was conducted in the local language for better understanding. 

# **Program Summary**

- (b) 2<sup>nd</sup> Party NITTE (Deemed to be University) India is an esteemed Deemed-to-be-University in India established under section 3 of UGC Act 1956-accredited by NAAC with A grade & also ranked as A category deemed University by MHRD Govt of India.
- (c) Both parties, having come to known about the qualitative programmes and services of each other had shown willingness to enter into a MoU for the purpose of Research and Education in the mutually agreeable fields. # 4. Terms and conditions

- (a) In accordance with a mutual desire to contribute to field of medicine through collaborative research projects both parties have mutually agreed to enter into this Memorandum of Understanding (MOU).
- (b) Both parties will mutually agree upon funding, chemical purchase, Equipment accessories, Financials and related aspects. Generally, the responsibility of delivering/undertaking the activities planned will be of First party or second party or both Parties jointly and accordingly funds for the programme/ activities/ projects shall be financially supported by any one of the parties. Supporting organization may be acknowledged as agreed between parties.
- (c) The infrastructure for running of said programme will be facilitated by both the parties as mutually agreed. However, both parties shall see to it that safety and security of students, employees and all other parties who are engaged under this MoU be ensured.
- (d) Confidentiality: Both parties shall maintain confidentiality with respect to any confidential information of respective parties and the confidential information in connection to the respective projects under this MoU. If required, Parties may enter into separate confidentiality agreements as per the requirements of specific or respective projects/programmes under this MoU.
- (e) Relationship between the parties: This Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) is intended solely as a MoU and no partnership, joint venture, employment agency, franchise, or other form of agreement or relationship is intended. It is specifically understood between the parties that the relationship between the parties contemplated under this MoU is strictly on principal to principal basis. Nothing in this MoU shall be construed to the employees / representatives / students of one Party to be construed as the employees / representatives / students of the other party. However, both parties shall ensure the following:
  - i. Both Parties shall see to it that the respective students and employees engaged under this MoU shall strictly follow the disciplinary protocols and be professional in their conduct towards each other.
  - ii. Both Parties shall see to it that "Safety and Security" of the respective employees / students engaged under this MoU be ensured.

(f) Law of the land: Both parties hereby agree and undertake to abide and confirm with the respective law of the land, and, terms and conditions of the agreements which might be entered upon under this MoU. Licenses/ Approval/s or / clearance/s from statutory authorities/bodies if any, shall be obtained by the respective parties where ever applicable.

### 3. Term of the MoU:

- (a) This Memorandum of Understanding shall be valid and effective after approval of the terms and conditions of the agreement by the appropriate authorities of the both parties It will remain valid and effective for a period of Two years from 2020 to August 2023. There after the parties to this MoU are at liberty to review the period of this MoU by mutual consent for any further period, one Month before the expiry of the term vide a fresh MoU.
- (b) This MoU may be treated as terminated / cancelled / withdrawn by either parties of MoU for any valid reason with one month prior notice to the other party, and in such case, the ongoing projects will be allowed to be completed as per the mutual understanding of both parties.
- 4. Dispute resolution: Not withstanding anything contained in any other statute for the time being in force, if any genuine dispute arises between the parties in the discharge of their respective responsibilities and obligations under this MoU and in case such dispute is not settled amicably between the parties, it shall be referred to the VICE CHANCELLOR of NITTE (Deemed to be University) & The Director of the First Party for arbitration and both shall jointly appoint or nominate an arbitrator as per the procedures in vogue for resolving the said dispute and the decision of said Arbitrator shall be final as far as the dispute is concerned and the parties are bound by that decision.

### <u>AGREEMENT</u>

### Alvernia University, USA

and

### Padmashree Institute of Management & Sciences, India

This Agreement, entered as of February 15, 2022 ("Effective Date"), is by and between Alvernia University and the Padmashree Institute of Management & Sciences, India. Alvernia University and Padmashree Institute of Management & Sciences hereinafter shall be referred to as the "Parties."

WHEREAS, the Parties intend to collaborate to provide opportunities for Indian students to complete coursework and/or degree programs at Alvernia University, the Parties enter this Agreement as the first initiative of the Padmashree Institute of Management & Sciences Collaboration.

### **Terms of Agreement**

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of their mutual covenants and promises, the parties intending to be legally bound hereby agree as follows:

- Overview. Alvernia University agrees to offer to qualified Padmashree Institute of Management & Sciences students the Masters of Business Administration Degree with Healthcare Emphasis Program (the "Program") through Padmashree Institute of Management & Sciences, subject to the provisions hereinafter. [See Appendix 1 for Curriculum Scope and Sequence for the Program.] The program consists of 12 courses; 3 (three) courses will be offered online by Alvernia University during Part 1, and 9 (Nine) courses will be offered on-campus by Alvernia University during Part 2.
- 2. Coursework. The Program will be offered in 2 parts. The timeline for the Program is based on Alvernia University semester scheduling and will proceed as follows:
  - a) Part 1 (January, 2022). During Part 1, only students who are in their final year of study of undergraduate program shall take three online courses along with their Bachelors for Business Administration (BBA), Bachelor of Health Administration (BHA) or Bachelor of Public Health (BPH) coursework. Padmashree Institute of Management & Sciences will be responsible for recruiting qualified students to participate in the Program.
    - 1) Padmashree Institute of Management & Sciences students must complete their 3-years bachelor's degree from Padmashree Institute of Management & Sciences and 3 (three) online courses from Alvernia University before they can take the on-campus Part 2 of the program.
    - 2) No Padmashree Institute of Management & Sciences student who fails to complete their 3-year bachelor's degree program in India and achieve a final cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or less (equivalent to a letter grade of B) in the 3 online courses of Part 1, will be permitted to enroll in coursework for Part 2 at Alvernia University.
  - b) Part 2 (January, 2023). During Part 2, all remaining 9 (nine) courses for the MBA will be offered on-site at Alvernia University.
    - 1) Each Padmashree Institute of Management & Sciences student must complete all Part 1 & 2 coursework with a final cumulative grade point average of 3.0 (equivalent to a letter grade of B) or higher in order to earn an MBA Degree.
    - 2) <u>Housing</u>. Alvernia University will assign students housing and agrees to provide the same level of housing to students that is provided to Alvernia University students.
    - 3) <u>Transportation</u>. MBA students will be responsible for transportation to and from Alvernia University campus. Alvernia University will assist Padmashree Institute of Management & Sciences students in securing transportation and agrees to provide the same level of support to Padmashree Institute of Management & Sciences students that is provided to Alvernia University students who are seeking transportation.

- 4) <u>Campus</u>. On-site courses for the Programs may be offered at Alvernia University campus in Reading, Pennsylvania.
- 5) <u>Modality</u>. Part 2 coursework shall be offered in on-site, online, and/or hybrid modalities to qualified students.
  - Alvernia University agrees that Padmashree Institute of Management & Sciences students who obtain a visa will be offered course in on-site mode during Part 2 course work.
- c) Preliminary Preparation. Students who possess undergraduate degrees in a non-business field, and who do not have significant business-related work experience, are required to take <u>BA 500 MBA Fundamentals</u> in preparation for MBA coursework. BA 500 is a 5-module, online, self-paced, 1 credit course that provides students with foundational knowledge and skills in a range of business education topic areas. Students must achieve a post-test score of 70% or better in each module to successfully complete the course. Students will be required to retake any modules in which they achieve a post-test score lower than 70%. BA 500 must be successfully completed before students can register for additional MBA coursework. This course should be taken at any time prior to enrolling in Part 1 courses. To help ensure the success of our students, and keeping aligned with our current policy, such students must be required to complete BA 500 as described, in addition to successfully passing Alvernia's MBA leveler courses (MBA 502, 504, 506) plus the MBA Pro Seminar course during Part 1 of the program to be accepted into Part 2.

### 3. Student Support Services

- a) Alvernia University agrees to provide information about student support services to Padmashree Institute of Management & Sciences (e.g., library resources, tutorial services). Alvernia University agrees to provide Padmashree Institute of Management & Sciences students the same access to student support services that is provided to Alvernia University students to foster Padmashree Institute of Management & Sciences students' success.
- b) Padmashree Institute of Management & Sciences students must have access to technology with remote capability that aligns with Alvernia University guidelines and standards. As these guidelines are subject to change, Padmashree Institute of Management & Sciences students are responsible for consulting course syllabi and/or the Alvernia University website for the applicable guidelines and standards at the commencement of their coursework.
- c) Alvernia University agrees to provide Padmashree Institute of Management & Sciences students with the same level of technology support and training for classroom technology that is provided to Alvernia University students.
- d) Alvernia University agrees to provide Padmashree Institute of Management & Sciences students with the same level of support to obtain up to one year of OPT (Optional Practical Training) in relevant industry that is provided to Alvernia University students.

#### 4. Marketing

- a) Alvernia University agrees to provide necessary marketing materials to assist Padmashree Institute of Management & Sciences in promoting the Program and courses to Padmashree Institute of Management & Sciences students and parents.
- b) Neither party will use any name, trademark, logo, or other indicia of the other party without, in each instance, prior written approval from such other party. Such approval shall not be unreasonably withheld.

### 5. Administrative Support

a) Contact. Each Party agrees to identify a point of contact to provide oversight for the Program, Alvernia University will provide one contact person with full contact credentials in the event parents or students would like to connect with Alvernia University directly, and Padmashree Institute of Management & Sciences will have these details along with the Padmashree Institute of Management & Sciences contact person on all digital marketing materials. The Alvernia University

- contact person is Dr. Sibel Ahi, Director of International Student Recruitment. Dr. Ahi's email address is sibel.ahi@alvernia.edu.
- b) <u>Textbooks and Supplies</u>. Alvernia University will make available the list of books recommended for the students of Padmashree Institute of Management & Sciences to enable them to purchase them before start of the program.

### 6. Finances

- a) Padmashree Institute of Management & Sciences students participating under this Agreement will be billed and payments made in accordance with Alvernia University's procedures for international students as further outlined in Appendix 2. Tuition and fees are as follows for Padmashree Institute of Management & Sciences students participating in the MBA program at Alvernia University:
  - 1) The tuition fees for coursework are\*.

#### 7. Term and Termination

- This Agreement shall become effective as of the Effective Date and shall continue in effect until:
  - 1) August 31, 2025; or
  - Both Alvernia University and Padmashree Institute of Management & Sciences agree to extend or amend this agreement or
  - 3) Sooner terminated as hereinafter provided.
- b) Either Party may terminate this Agreement for any reason by providing the other Party with (90) day's written notice of its intention to terminate.
- c) If this Agreement is terminated as described above, and only if Padmashree Institute of Management & Sciences students are not in default as defined below, Alvernia University will take all reasonable steps to assure completion of any courses in-progress. Alvernia University may ensure the completion of in-progress courses by providing such courses in on-site, online, and/or hybrid modalities. If this Agreement is terminated as described above, Alvernia University will not offer or begin any new courses with Padmashree Institute of Management & Sciences.

- 8. Default. The following events shall be considered "events of default":
  - a) The failure of Padmashree Institute of Management & Sciences students to pay tuition or any other sum payable to Alvernia University within thirty (30) days after the same shall become due and payable; or
  - b) The failure to perform, violation, or breach by either Party of any of the terms or conditions hereof.
- 9. Effect of Event of Default. In the event of an "event of default" as defined above, the Party may elect to give the defaulting Party written notice of such default and, if the defaulting Party does not cure any such default within ten working (10) days after the giving of such notice (or if such default is of such a nature that it cannot be completely cured within the ten working (10) day period and the defaulting Party does not commence such curing within five (5) days and thereafter proceed with reasonable diligence and in good faith to cure such default), then the Party may terminate this Agreement on an additional five working (5) days written notice to the defaulting Party.
- 10. Indemnification. Padmashree Institute of Management & Sciences agrees to indemnify and hold harmless Alvernia University, and its affiliates, successors, assignees and their respective directors, officers, shareholders, employees and agents (the "Indemnified Parties"), for all defense and other legal costs as well as from and against all losses, costs, damages, expenses and liabilities (including reasonable legal fees and court costs) which may be suffered or incurred by any of the Indemnified Parties as a result of any: (i) action/inaction or the alleged conduct of Padmashree Institute of Management & Sciences; (ii) in the instance its students participating under this Agreement, bring any cause of action against Alvernia University; (iii) the infringement, violation or misappropriation of the intellectual property rights of Alvernia University.
- 11. Force Majeure. In the event a Party's failure to perform any obligation under this Agreement shall be due to a Force Majeure such Party shall not be considered in default of such performance. In the event a Force Majeure renders the continued performance of this Agreement unfeasible, this Agreement shall be null and void, and the Parties shall have no further obligations under this Agreement. In addition, no Party shall be relieved of liability for failure of performance to the extent such failure shall be caused by it, due to causes arising out of its negligence or due to normal or remedial causes which it fails to remove to remedy within a reasonable period of time. Any Party rendered unable to fulfill any of its obligations by reason of a Force Majeure shall give prompt notice of such fact to the other Party and shall exercise due diligence to remove such inability within a reasonable time period. Unless the Force Majeure renders the Agreement unfeasible, during the Party's inability to perform by reason of a Force Majeure, the other party's obligations under this Agreement shall be suspended. As soon as the party declaring Force Majeure is able to resume performance of its obligations, the Party shall give prompt notice to the other Party. A Force Majeure shall mean any event or circumstance beyond the control of and not the result of the negligence of, or caused by, a Party, including but not limited to failure or threat of failure of facilities, landslides, lightning, earthquake, storm, hurricane, flood, tornado, or other acts of God, fire or explosions, transportation accidents, epidemic, pandemic, sabotage, riot, war, acts of public enemy and civil disturbance or disobedience, strike, lockout, work stoppages, and other industrial disturbances or disputes, or restraint by court order or other governmental authority.
- 12. Notice. Except as otherwise provided in this Agreement, all notices and other communications, which are to be given under this Agreement, shall be in writing and shall be sent by hand delivery, courier (including overnight delivery service such as FedEx or UPS), registered or certified mail, in all cases fees and postage prepaid, addressed to the Party to receive the notice or communication at the address identified above for such Party or such other address as such Party shall designate by notice to the other. All notices to Alvernia University shall be sent to the contact person listed below. All notices to Padmashree Institute of Management & Sciences shall be sent to Dr. Lynne Coy-Ogan at the address listed below. It is the responsibility of the Party changing its address to notify the other Party of any change of address.

13. Choice of Law and Venue. This Agreement shall be governed by, adjudicated, construed, and interpreted in accordance with the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, irrespective of any conflict of law provisions. Each of the Parties irrevocably submits to the exclusive jurisdiction and venue of the courts in Berks County, Pennsylvania, or the United States District Court for the Middle District of Pennsylvania for the purpose of any suit, action or other proceeding arising out of or in connection with this Agreement or the subject matter hereof brought by either Party or their successors or assignees.

### 14. General Provisions

- a) Alvernia University represents that it is a Middle States Commission on Higher Education (MSCHE) and Accreditation Council for Business Schools and Programs (ACBSP), and has affirmed its commitment to excellence in business education. [See Appendix 3 for Accreditation Certification.]
- b) All Padmashree Institute of Management & Sciences students enrolled and participating in this program are expected to comply with Alvernia University's policies and procedures that apply to all of its students. Any Padmashree Institute of Management & Sciences student dismissed from the MBA program for academic or other reasons wilt be responsible for returning to India according to SEVP regulations. Alvernia University will not be responsible for any costs incurred as a result of dismissal.
- c) During Part 1 taking place in the final year of the 3-year undergraduate studies through Padmashree Institute of Management & Sciences, Padmashree Institute of Management & Sciences will be responsible for and have sole authority over all matters pertaining to the administration of the coursework including but not limited to admission, course scheduling, enrollment, curriculum requirements, course content, and grades. Alvernia University will be responsible for and have sole authority over all matters pertaining to Alvernia University Online Coursework.
- d) During Part 2, Alvernia University will be responsible for and have sole authority over all matters pertaining to the administration coursework including but not limited to admission, course scheduling, enrollment, curriculum requirements, course content, grades, and graduation.
- e) Neither Party shall have the right to assign this Agreement without the prior written consent of the other Party. A waiver of any default, breach or non-compliance under this Agreement is not effective unless in writing and signed by the Party to be bound by the waiver. The waiver by a Party of any default, breach or non-compliance under this Agreement will not operate as a waiver of that Party's rights under this Agreement in respect of any continuing or subsequent default, breach, or non-compliance (whether of the same or any other nature).
- f) This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement of the Parties with respect to the subject matter hereof and supersedes all prior agreements, understandings, negotiations and discussions, whether oral or written, of any of the Parties in respect of the subject matter hereof. No modification hereof shall be binding upon any of the Parties hereto unless made in writing and signed by the Parties.
- g) Unless otherwise specified in a separate writing, this agreement will not result in any form of cost sharing or cause one party to incur expenses on behalf of the other. Each party is liable for its own costs and expenses in relation to any undertakings arising from this memorandum. Padmashree Institute of Management & Sciences students participating in this program are expected to have sufficient financial resources to cover the costs of travel, tuition, room, board, and other miscellaneous expenses as well as the cost of travel for emergency purposes or as a result of dismissal from the program.

- h) Nothing in this document shall be implied to create a joint venture, partnership, or agency relationship between the party institutions. Nor does this memorandum give rise to any legal relationship between the parties.
- i) Each Party represents and warrants to the other Party that the person signing this Agreement has the full authority to do so.
- j) Subject to the following sentence, in no event will either Party have any liability, whether based on warranty, contract, tort, negligence, strict liability or any other legal theory, at any time for any indirect, special, punitive, incidental, or consequential damages, even if advised of the possibility of such damages. Notwithstanding the foregoing, this subsection 14(j) will not limit the liability or obligations under the Indemnification Section 10.

### Appendix I: Curriculum Scope and Sequence

### Part 1: Online (three courses)

MBA xxx: Pro Seminar\* (1 credit)

This course prepares and equips students for academic success as they pursue an advanced business degree. LMS familiarity, academic expectations, support services, database overviews, and related tools and services are introduced and reviewed.

COR 520: Ethics and Moral Leadership (3 credits)

A discussion and analysis of philosophies of moral leadership. The course is designed to present a vision for the development of reflective, responsible, and socially engaged leadership for the community, workplace, society, and the global world. It will include the study of topics such as: theories of and approaches to moral leadership; the ideal relationship between leaders and followers; historical exemplars of moral leadership; and the contrast between moral and immoral leadership. This course facilitates interdisciplinary dialogue and stimulates discussion of ethical leadership.

MBA 506: Economics and Finance (3 credits)

The purpose of this course is to provide foundations in economics and finance for students who have entered the program with limited exposure to economics and finance. The course is designed to provide students with an understanding of the basis for economic theory and financial decision making. Only applicable for students who require levelling coursework.

\*MBA xxx: Pro Seminar is being designed at the request of Padmashree Institute of Management & Sciences, India, with the expectation of curricular approval by the end of AY21/22. If MBA xxx: Pro Seminar does not become a course option for fall 2022, then MBA 502: Accounting for the Workplace will serve as the replacement course.

MBA 502: Accounting for the Workplace (3 credits)

This course is designed to introduce students to accounting who have not had accounting courses or accounting experience at the undergraduate level. The course fosters an understanding of the basic concepts of financial accounting, including accounting information systems. Only applicable for students who require levelling coursework.

### Part 2: On-Site (nine courses)

MBA 513: Accounting for Healthcare Executives (3 credits)

This course focuses on basic accounting as applied in health care management. Students learn the vocabulary of, and introduction to, the tools and concepts employed by finance officers in the healthcare field. Students will learn to assess healthcare financial information and apply the knowledge gained to aid management and budgeting functions.

MBA 518: Managerial Communication (3 credits)

Provides strategies that will be employed through hands-on experiences to enhance critical communication skills emphasizing listening, speaking, and writing skills as well as individual and group communication strategies. The goal of this course is to develop managers and leaders who communicate in a creative and effective manner, motivate associates, and enhance teamwork by understanding and strategically applying appropriate managerial communication concepts.

MBA 520: Marketing Services (3 credits)

This course is designed to provide students with a broad approach to the concepts of various marketing functions including consumer behavior and new product development. Emphasis is placed on international issues and their impact on the development of strategies for consumer and industrial-based products or services entering the global market. Prerequisite: Prior coursework in marketing or MBA 504 — Management and Marketing.

MBA 571/NUR 570: Healthcare Informatics (3 credits)

This course provides the framework for graduate nursing students to enhance their knowledge and skills in the use of nursing informatics and healthcare technology. Emphases is placed on the technology-based healthcare applications and the nurse's role in effectively managing information that impacts nursing care delivery, safety, and outcomes. Students will apply knowledge and skills from nursing science, computer science, and information science to develop leadership competencies to successfully support evidence-based clinical practice and administrative, educational, and research decision making for safe and quality care.

MBA 611: Legal Aspects of Medical Environments (3 credits)

This course focuses on political, legislative, and legal issues impacting healthcare systems and the diverse communities they serve. Policies and decisions based on current case studies are examined with emphasis placed on vulnerabilities and the appropriate techniques of managing exposure risks.

### MBA 620: Managerial Economics (3 credits)

This course examines the use of economic tools for managerial decision-making. Applicable economic, statistical and computer skills are studied. Emphasis is placed on the microeconomic theory of organizations and its application in non-profit organizations, churches, schools, and businesses.

### MBA 630: Management Finance (3 credits)

This course presents an overview of financial management and its role within non-profit organizations, churches, schools, and businesses. The focus is on the prime variables that affect the financial manager within the firm and within the economy. Topics include financial management and its environment, analysis of the operating budget and its impact on setting priorities, valuation and the cost of capital, capital budgeting, working capital management, analyzing and planning financial performance, and institutional features of long-term planning. Prerequisite: MBAS 620 — Managerial Economics.

### MBA 676: Strategic Management in Healthcare Systems (3 credits)

Strategic planning is an important tool in an ever-changing healthcare environment. This course is a study of the development and implementation of strategic plans conceived by executive level management in healthcare systems. Students have the opportunity to apply previously studied topics in HC MBA to study new sophisticated material dealing specifically with changes that affect strategic planning.

### MBA 680: Executive Leadership Seminar (3 credits)

This is a capstone course and is designed to enhance development of the knowledge, skills, attitudes, behaviors and values required for one to become an effective, inspirational leader. In addition to case studies, interaction with successful business executives provides students with realistic models of leadership. (To be taken with the final 12 credits).
